It's Not All Bad News

A couple of church members wrote me the other day asking if the church maintained a Minister's Discretionary Fund which could be used to help people in need. "Yes, we do," I wrote back. They offered to make a donation to the fund and here is what they wrote:

"When we heard about the stimulus program due to Covid 19, we thought that we didn't need that. We had worked many years earning good salaries and had both put money aside almost from the beginning. We lived a fairly simple, frugal life. Money should go to those in need—those who lost their jobs, those who are hurting from business closures, or dealing with illness.

"Nothing arrived. We forgot about the stimulus program. Close to the end of May we got a check. Now what? We are fine. After very little discussion we decided that half the check would go to the Minister's Discretionary Fund at the church to be used for those less fortunate. The other half will go to aid small businesses in our county.

"We hope that this situation will bring about changes in our collective thinking and that more people will save for future unknown events, that we as a country will give thought to our level of preparedness, deal with the inequalities in this country, and recognize the need for strong, thoughtful leadership."

Grocery Cards Still Available for Purchase

Food City and Ingles grocery cards are available and can be mailed or delivered to you!

The cards we currently have in our possession were purchased well over 8 weeks ago. They are kept in ziplock bags and are not exposed to anything.

Cards can be delivered to mailboxes in the Johnson City or Kingsport area, and possibly to others areas. Of course, the cards could also be mailed. We will happily accommodate your needs so that we can continue to generate a wee bit of income for the church.

No volunteers are needed for Kitchen of Hope this month, but we are still serving meals.

The Kitchen of Hope is still serving meals to folks in need. In fact, the numbers have risen to 200+ a day. In an effort to keep volunteers and guests as safe as possible, the logistics have changed. Instead of a sit-down community meal, we now must serve to-go meals only, at the door, one at a time. We have adapted to this situation. And we, too, want to limit potential exposure for you.

Until things get back to normal, if you would like to help, please consider donating either money or food items that can go in a lunch bag. We serve once a month, but the Kitchen of Hope serves 6 nights a week.

Gathering Guidelines May 30 through July 31, 2020

We strongly recommend continuing to use online forums for small group/committee/team meetings. However, starting May 30 through July 31, 2020, the HVUUC Board has voted to start allowing people on site for activities that must be held in person, e.g. work groups.

The following guidelines apply:

- Groups of 10 people and less
- The Fred Ball room (fellowship hall), sanctuary, and deck are the only meeting areas that are allowed. The REZ is still off limits.
- Must wear a face mask (please bring your own).
- Must wash hands with soap and water upon entering for 20 seconds, or use hand sanitizer and let air dry.
- Continue keeping a distance of 6 feet between people of different households.
- If you are ill, have a fever/cough, are someone who is at increased risk, or traveled to endemic areas infected with COVID-19, please stay home and enjoy online content only.
- Must clean commonly touched hard surfaces like door handles, light switches, counter tops, metal surfaces (chair backs), etc., when finished.
- Use the church calendar to coordinate groups. Contact Karyn at office@hvuuc.org
- No children's activities allowed at this time.

Online services (on YouTube) will continue during this time. Look for more information regarding home RE kits for kids in the coming days.

Please use the cleaning wipes and/or bleach solution and paper towels set in the foyer for cleaning/disinfecting after each visit. If you have disinfecting wipes/hand sanitizer that can be donated, please contact facilities@hvuuc.org.
