Kingsport Kitchen of Hope 1st Monday of the Month

In the basement of the Full Gospel Mission on Sevier St in Kingsport, is a tiny kitchen staffed entirely by volunteers that feeds dinner 6 days a week to 100-130 people. Diners have ranged from infant to 88. For many of them, it's their only meal of the day. HVUUC is now serving dinner at the Kitchen of Hope the first Monday of each month. How can you help? Glad you asked.

The menu changes monthly. Volunteers are needed to help cook, serve and clean up.

Set up/cooking: 1:00-3:30

Servers: 3:00-5:00 Cleaners: 4:45-6:00

The kitchen is quite small, so if you want to help, please contact the coordinator so we don't end up with too many cooks in the kitchen!

You can also help by donating food or money for food. Or if you'd like to bake cookies, cupcakes, or other desserts ahead of time (note: we cook for 150, so if it's too much, you could always split this with another baker)

Like to plan ahead? We do this the first Monday of every month, so pencil us in with a big red pen!

Holston Habitat for Humanity Faith Build Project

Holston Habitat for Humanity has a new Faith Build Project in Kingsport, Tennessee. Faith Build is a project involving churches and synagogues which provide volunteers to build homes either in Kingsport or Johnson City.

The next project is at **1620** *E.* **Street, Kingsport, Tennessee**. The ground breaking is in mid-February. The dates for HVUUC volunteers is April 19-22 and we'll be working on finish siding and interior painting.

Each volunteer can do all four days or one, two, or three days. It doesn't matter if you have experience or not. There is a Site Supervisor to show you what to do! Also, Youth Volunteers (14-17 years of age) are allowed to volunteer with a few provisions.

This project is for Nadine and her family. Nadine is a Kingsport resident and single mother of four children. She is full-time employee of a local restaurant. Nadine was approved for Habitat for Humanity homeownership in July, 2015. She completed 250 for 300 hours of preliminary sweat equity this past year. She will be working with volunteers to complete her home.

Tom Perez is our volunteer coordinator and will collect the paperwork for volunteers (Volunteer Sheet and a Release Waiver Sheet). You may have completed an information sheet before, but they are renewed every year, so it is time to fill them out again. Starting January 1, 2017, after the service, Tom Perez will be at the church to collect paperwork from anyone who wants to volunteer for this service. Also, we can decide what days we want to ask for, although it is not guaranteed. We can choose two timeframes. First come, first serve.

Also, a Hospitality Coordinator will organize lunch and snacks for our volunteer dates. Peggy Perez will do this for now. She will be looking for volunteers too!

Please consider volunteering for this Holston Habitat for Humanity Faith Build. As volunteers from Holston Valley Unitarian Universalist Church, we would provide a hand up and hope to Nadine and her family, helping build their affordable, safe, accessible Habitat for Humanity home.


