In addition to some amazing collaborative worship services coming up, and a new year of fall religious education programing just around the corner, we have some other special opportunities for learning, service and fellowship on the horizon that you may want to be on the lookout for:

Listening & Caring Workshop: On Saturday August 12th from 10:30am until noon, I will be leading a workshop oriented around listening skills that can be especially helpful when visiting church members and friends when hospitalized, shut-in or otherwise isolated. This training is modeled off of similar programs held in Unitarian Universalist congregations throughout the country, and centers around skills like Reflective Listening and Open Ended Questions. Church Potluck Picnic: Connecting over a meal is one of the best ways to build community, and it doesn't really feel like the church year has begun until we have had our church Picnic. 
Peace Focus Group:

- T. Tell your peers to be S-M-A-R-T



August 21: Governor Bill Lee has called for a special session of the Tennessee General Assembly to begin August 21 "to strengthen public safety and preserve constitutional rights." The session is to "...pursue thoughtful, practical measures that strengthen the safety of Tennesseans, preserve Second Amendment rights, prioritize due process protections, support law enforcement and address mental health." While word "guns" is not mentioned in the press release; the call of this session is a direct reaction to the public pressure put on Lee and the legislature after the Coventry School murders in March. Many gun safety and democracy groups are planning to be in Nashville on opening day. Many state legislators are asking Gov. Lee to cancel the session.

This is the time for all Tennessee citizens to communicate their thoughts and suggestions to the Governor and state legislators on how to reduce gun violence (now, the #1 killer of children in the country), and, specifically, in our state (#11 in the Nation).
