### Communication is Key

My friends, during this holiday season, it seems like we have a LOT going on! And while there's a lot of information going out about our events, services, and service projects, if you're not plugged into our communications channels it's easy to miss something. So today I'm going to outline for you the best ways to stay connected, with a little help from Jessica, our Office Administrator.

**E-News:** This is the best way to keep in touch with what's going on in general. If you sign up for our E -News, you will receive regular emails about announcements and events. There are two ways to sign up for E-News. One is to share your email and check the box to subscribe to E-News at the Visitor's table, in the guest book. The other is to visit www.hvuuc.org and scroll all the way down to the bottom of the page where you'll find the words "Mailing List Sign-Up" When you sign up make sure to select "Daily Digest" for both options.

What if I'm signed up for E-News and am not getting daily emails? It is probably going to your "Spam" or "Promotions" folder in your email. Every email system is different and that's not something that we can influence here in the office. Facebook: Facebook is not as reliable of a news sources as E-News but it can be a great way of creating community. **Emerging Communications Areas:** As time goes by and we find more Gen Z folks in our congregation (Gen Z is currently from age 10 to 25), email and Facebook are going to become less effective. We don't currently have better ways to communicate, but are open to discovering how to reach others. How can I help? We have a small and mighty communications team and could really use some extra help. It would be ideal to have a person committed to keeping up with our Facebook communications to lighten that load on our communications team. You can also purchase "Delivery" & your items will be delivered to your home after the in-person sale on Dec 11.

If you'd rather pay by cash or check, you can do so when you pick up your items at the in-person sale.

If you want to shop in person, vendors will be in the Fred Ball Room from noon-2PM on Sunday Dec 11. You can pay with any of the 4 options and take your items with you. NOTE: Some vendors will be ONLY online and some ONLY in person—so be sure to check both venues—you don't want to miss anything! The online catalog will continue to grow as artists submit their items—check back often.
