Meet Our Ministerial Intern!

Greetings Holston Valley Unitarian Universalist Church! I am Tiffany Sapp, your ministerial intern for the 2018-2019 school year. My family and I are thrilled to be moving up to Johnson City, TN this summer and I am excited to be working on full time parish ministry with your congregation. I have gotten to know your congregation from occasional visits, but you probably don't know much about me yet, so let's see if I can share a little bit about myself and my relationship with Unitarian Universalism.



I grew up in Protestant Military Base Chapels (my Dad was in the Air Force) and occasionally a Presbyterian Church when we didn't live on base. While I was going to college at Carson-Newman College in Jefferson City, TN, I became United Methodist. I went to Duke Divinity School with the intention of being a United Methodist Minister. But by the time I finished seminary I realized that my embrace of other religions and my passion for LGBTQ+ rights were going to disqualify me from their ministry. I stayed with United Methodism for about a year after seminary before I just left the church completely. I spent a few years embracing my skepticism before a personal tragedy led me to seek out a spiritual community. That's when I joined the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Bay County in Panama City, FL where I have been an active member for the last ten years. I've served my home congregation in many capacities, including two and a half years as their paid Religious Exploration Coordinator. During the time I was learning that I had always been a UU and just didn't know it, I also discovered Paganism and have enjoyed seeing how complementary those paths are to each other.

My initial attraction to Unitarian Universalism is that it was an accepting place where I could find a different way of being religious that wasn't attached to dogma and judgement. It provided a safe community where I could heal. In this context my concept of the what is sacred continued to expand, and I've come to appreciate that while there is so little that we can be certain of, we can embrace the power of love, both within us and around us. I was introduced to the theological work of James Luther Adams, and became intrigued by the idea that Unitarian Universalism is a "Living Tradition." It is exciting to be part of a religion that recognizes that no one has "figured it out" yet, and that our religion will continue to grow and evolve as humanity grows and evolves.

That growth process happens best in community, so as I enter into your community, it is with the hope that your perspectives and wisdom will influence my understanding of myself, this adventure of life, and Unitarian Universalism. I love how you guys do worship together and can't wait to get some experience working with Jeff on Sunday morning. I need to do a lot of growth in Social Justice, not just talking about it but doing it. I love doing Pastoral Care work and am hopeful that I will be able to contribute to the well being of your community in this way.

My constant companions on this journey are my husband, Jayon, and our daughter Bridget, who is seven. I'm sure you'll get a chance to get to know both of them, though Jayon's work has him away from home 50% of the time so you'll see him less frequently. My parents live in Roan Mountain, and are thrilled to become Bridget's primary babysitters once we're in Tennessee.

I want to thank all of you for giving me this opportunity to learn and to serve in your congregation. I look forward to seeing you this summer!

Adult RE 1 began a new series on Sunday, September 10th *Why Evil Exists* – 36 lectures from The Great Courses, Professor Charles Mathews, Ph.D., University of Virginia

The "problem of evil" is one of the oldest and most fundamental concerns of human existence. Since ancient times, questions surrounding evil have preoccupied every major religion, as well as many of history's greatest secular thinkers, from early philosophers to contemporary social theorists.

Whether we view it in theological, philosophical, or psychological terms, evil remains both a deeply intriguing question and a crucially relevant global issue. From organized terrorism to genocidal conflicts, from environmental destruction to the ongoing nuclear threat, human actions that most of us would consider evil play a central role in the dialogue between nations and peoples, affecting not only our well-being, but the very survival of our civilizations. Diners have ranged from infant to 88. For many of them, it's their only meal of the day. The church serves dinner at the Kitchen of Hope the first Monday of each month. How can you help? Glad you asked.

The menu changes monthly. Volunteers are needed to help cook, serve and clean up.

Set up/cooking: 1:00-3:30

Servers: 3:00-5:00

Cleaners: 4:45-6:00

The kitchen is quite small, so if you want to help, please contact the coordinator so we don't end up with too many cooks in the kitchen!

You can also help by donating food or money for food. Or if you'd like to bake cookies, cupcakes, or other desserts ahead of time (note: we cook for 150, so if it's too much, you could always split this with another baker)
