## How to Zoom!

Everyone is welcome to attend the meeting, however only members may vote. To ensure we have quorum and to tally votes we need all voting members to register and attend the meeting **on their own device** (smartphone, computer, tablet). This means multiple members in a family need to register separately and on a separate device. Each participant should register in advance using this link: <u>Annual Meeting—Zoom Registration</u>

After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the meeting. You will be muted when you enter and will not be able to unmute yourself. If you have a question or comment, please use the "raise hand" function (see below). You will be called on and unmuted in order of hand raises. If someone answers your question you can "lower" your hand.

Voting will happen via polls, which is why every voting member must register and attend on a separate device. Please answer each question AND hit 'submit" to vote. The results will be tabulated automatically.

#### If you are new to Zoom, please don't wait until the last minute to check this out.

If you haven't used Zoom before, you will need to download the Zoom app to your phone or computer . <u>https://zoom.us/</u>. Please do this! Once Zoom is installed, click the URL sent to your email after registering to head directly into the meeting.

- You might have to choose an "Audio Conference Option."
- You can connect to video conferencing from a tablet or smart phone if using your computer is problematic.
- If your computer or device has working speakers and microphone, choose "Computer Audio" or "Device Audio."
- If your computer or device does not have working speakers/microphone, choose "Phone Call," pick the appropriate option, and use your phone to hear/talk.

#### Participating in a Zoom Meeting:

You might have to start video manually (video camera icon). You might have to join audio manually (headphones icon). Everyone will be muted when they enter the meeting.

Since this is a meeting with a large number of participants, the host will unmute participants when they have a question or something to say, it's just like passing the microphone.

On some devices there will be viewing options, we recommend using "Speaker View" rather than "Gallery View" for this meeting. The symbol for this is a grid of nine squares in the (usually) upper right corner of the screen.

#### **Raising Your Hand**

To raise your hand, click on the three dots/"more" in the lower right corner of your screen. (You might have to move your mouse for them to show up). You can lower your hand the same way. One last note on multiple devices in one physical room: Just don't do it. The audio feedback is painful. Each member should attend on their own device, from physically separated spaces.

### Do You Have Something to Say? Soapbox Sunday is July 5, 2020

Seeking individuals who have something to say, for our annual Soapbox Sunday service, July 5th, 2020.

"Soapbox Sunday" has become a tradition in many congregations. In this special service, members and friends exercise their right to free speech and "get up on their soapbox" to tell us something about which they are concerned or passionate. Topics can span a broad spectrum, as some past examples show: Palm Oil - Unintentional Harm to the Environment; Truth, Science, and Politics; The Power of Language; etc.

This service features five home-grown presentations, each one about 4 minutes each (400-500 words). Your service coordinators know that our youth probably have a LOT to say about the current state of our country and environment and their future, so we encourage young people to participate, as well. If public speaking puts you off, your coordinator can offer some help there, too, such as "interview style" if you'd prefer.

Instead of a sit-down community meal, we now must serve to-go meals only, at the door, one at a time. We have adapted to this situation. And we, too, want to limit potential exposure for you.

Until things get back to normal, if you would like to help, please consider donating either money or food items that can go in a lunch bag. We serve once a month, but the Kitchen of Hope serves 6 nights a week.
