# **Opportunities for Connection Abound**

With all the talk we've been hearing about our Service Auction, I've been thinking a lot about all of the amazing opportunities for connection that we have here at Holston Valley Unitarian Universalist Church. Sunday Services are nice, and they create a shared sense of values and inspiration among us, but it's hard to find your people when that's the only way you're involved here. Thankfully, there are so many other ways to connect.

#### ONLINE

-The HVUUC Families Facebook Group is pretty active. People share events and things they find inspiring or helpful for parenting. The group is even used to set up meetups for age-specific groups of kids and parents. Just search for "HVUUC Families Group" on Facebook.

-Our local Pagan Community also has an excellent Facebook presence, where they share pictures, information about upcoming events, and the occasional thought-provoking article. You can find them by searching "CUUPS of HVUUC"

#### FELLOWSHIP

-The Women's Group is a longtime running group where anyone who identifies as a Woman can get together at a member's house to socialize. They meet the first Friday of the month and you can email womensgroup@hvuuc.org to get more information

-The Men's Group is called MACHO (Men Achieving Community Helping Others). They work together on projects around the church and in the community. You can reach them at macho@hvuuc.org

-The Game Group occasionally meets to play games in the evening, usually about once a month. Keep an eye of the church calendar and the Events section of the web page to see when they're meeting

-The Atheist Group meets the first and third Wednesdays in the evening at an offsite location. A great chance to fellowship with some very interesting people. You can email atheists@hvuuc.org to find out where they're meeting up next.

#### LEARNING

-There are two Adult Religions Education classes on Sundays from 9:30 to 10:45. You can learn with others and get into some really interesting discussions.

-Covenant Groups are always popping up here and there, and are an excellent way to practice listening to each other around topics of interest. Some are ongoing and accept members rotating in, some are for a limited number of sessions on a specific topic. Watch the News section to see what's popping up!

-BUUK Club is a monthly book discussion group that is held at the church from 10AM until Noon on the third Tuesday of the month. You can email buukclub@hvuuc.org to find out what they're reading next!
