Yahoo Groups Mailing List to be Disabled November 13

We are making a change to our news gathering and email delivery systems and need your help (and patience).

What

- The Yahoo Group will be permanently disabled on November 13th. We're dropping Yahoo Groups in favor of putting all of our communications on the website and social media channels, with an email digest replacing Yahoo.
- To get your information to the new email digest you will need to go through the News and Events forms on the website.
- Please start using the forms right away!

Why

- People without a yahoo email currently can't get our emails.
- The new forms will make it easier for people to share complete information about news and events to all our various communications outlets AND make life easier for Karyn, the office administrator, by ensuring she doesn't have to chase missing information. We want everything to be online for ease of access and to promote the church.
- Maybe most importantly, the visibility of your news or event is going to be MUCH higher.

Challenges

- Items will need to be posted several days in advance, no more last minute sending.
- Deliverability: in testing we've seen emails go to the Promotions tab in Gmail. It's also possible emails may initially go to your junk/spam folder.
- It's a change from the status quo. That can be hard for everyone, but we think it will be worth it!

Seniors: One of the Many Blessings of Our Community

When I think of the term "senior", what comes to mind are Religious Education for children, Caring Team, Fellowship, Religious Services Committee, volunteering in our church community and the larger Tri-Cities area. Seniors play a crucial role in holding all of these together. It is hard to identify the age of someone who is included in this demographic. Somewhere between the age of 60 and beyond is what I am considering. The Holston Valley Unitarian Universalist Church's membership is about 50% seniors. It is a blessing to have them! It is not hard to see why some of them are so active in our church. Strong family relationships, financially stable, educated, and health care benefits are good reasons that our seniors can be productive.

However, not everyone is so fortunate to have these advantages. Some seniors are in failing health, their families are not near, or they have no relatives. They may have healthcare, but it is hard to get healthcare when you cannot or should not drive. Communication may be hard too. I know of people who have smart phones provided by well-meaning families, but they do not know how to use them, or to use the device to its full advantage. Last, but not least, everyone needs companionship, even seniors.

What am I asking of our church community? Look around; greet each senior. See what their needs are and do what you can to help. For example, a class can be organized for seniors (and others) about smart phones and internet capable tablets. Most importantly, provide companionship. Have a cup of coffee or tea with them, either at church or stop by their home if asked. Our sages are interesting and independent people. You might gain something!

Adult RE 1 began a new series on Sunday, September 10th *Why Evil Exists* – 36 lectures from The Great Courses, Professor Charles Mathewes, Ph.D., University of Virginia

The "problem of evil" is one of the oldest and most fundamental concerns of human existence. Since ancient times, questions surrounding evil have preoccupied every major religion, as well as many of history's greatest secular thinkers, from early philosophers to contemporary social theorists.

Whether we view it in theological, philosophical, or psychological terms, evil remains both a deeply intriguing question and a crucially relevant global issue. From organized terrorism to genocidal conflicts, from environmental destruction to the ongoing nuclear threat, human actions that most of us would consider evil play a central role in the dialogue between nations and peoples, affecting not only our well-being, but the very survival of our civilizations. Kingsport Kitchen of Hope 1st Monday of the Month

In the basement of the Full Gospel Mission on Sevier St in Kingsport, is a tiny kitchen staffed entirely by volunteers that feeds dinner 6 days a week to 100-130 people. Diners have ranged from infant to 88. For many of them, it's their only meal of the day. The church serves dinner at the Kitchen of Hope the first Monday of each month. How can you help? Glad you asked.

The menu changes monthly. Volunteers are needed to help cook, serve and clean up.

Set up/cooking: 1:00-3:30

Servers: 3:00-5:00 Cleaners: 4:45-6:00

The kitchen is quite small, so if you want to help, please contact the coordinator so we don't end up with too many cooks in the kitchen!

You can also help by donating food or money for food. Or if you'd like to bake cookies, cupcakes, or other desserts ahead of time (note: we cook for 150, so if it's too much, you could always split this with another baker)


