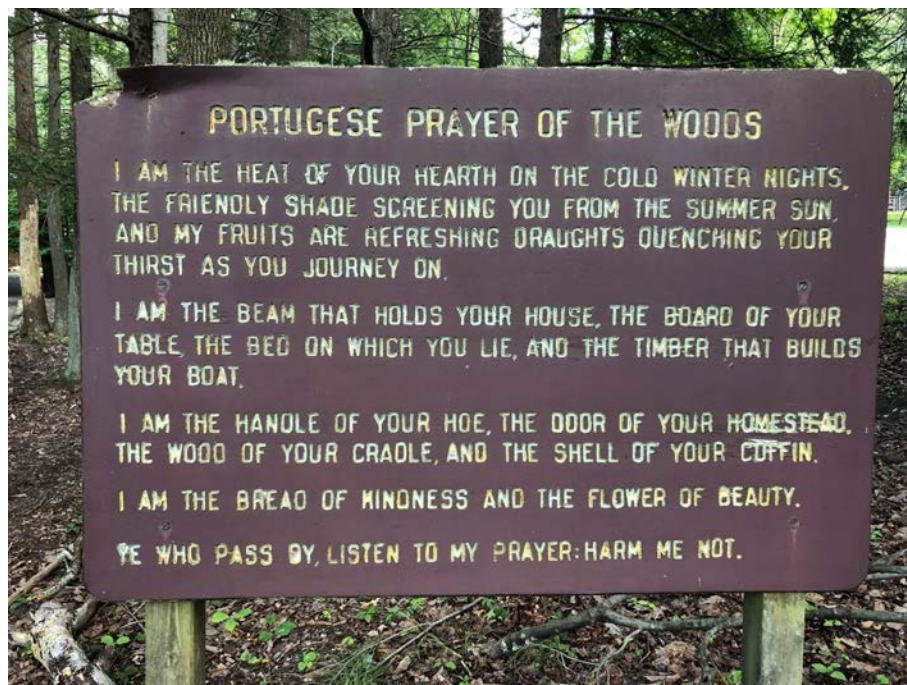

What's Happening in the RE Zone?

Camp was a smashing success!

I'd like to thank all of our volunteers, cheerleaders, those who donated items, those who donated money, and those who helped decorate and clean up. This was an enormous endeavor and I could not be more thrilled. We sold every spot and every child came each day! The donated items will start getting packed up through the first week of August. Moving on to our regularly scheduled Religious Education year...

We Need Teachers!

Teaching Religious Education is a wonderful gift for both the children as well as the adults. The first time I signed up, I was so scared! I worried that I wasn't smart enough, that I didn't have the skill set, that it would monopolize my precious time.... We have structured our Religious Education program to ease these concerns!



So what does being an RE teacher look like?

- Trust me, you have the skill set to be a teacher. The curriculum that is provided by the UUA is completely structured. You do not have to create a lesson plan!
- Our goal is to have 6-8 teachers on rotation in each classroom so that each person should only teach 1-2 times per month. You can fill in what days you're available on a classroom calendar (either Drop Box, Google Docs, or paper calendar). This leaves time for each person to also focus on their own spiritual needs.
- The Fellowship opportunities abound! By being an RE teacher, you get to know our young families in our congregation. Strengthening these relationships is essential to a healthy church community.

Our current classroom needs are:

- we need 4-6 teachers in Pre K-1st
- we need 2-4 teachers in 2nd-3rd
- we need 5-7 teachers in 4th-5th
- we need 5-7 teachers in Junior and Senior Youth

Kingsport Kitchen of Hope 1st Monday of the Month

In the basement of the Full Gospel Mission on Sevier St in Kingsport, is a tiny kitchen staffed entirely by volunteers that feeds dinner 6 days a week to 100-130 people. Diners have ranged from infant to 88. For many of them, it's their only meal of the day. The church serves dinner at the Kitchen of Hope the first Monday of each month. How can you help? Glad you asked.

The menu changes monthly. Volunteers are needed to help cook, serve and clean up.

Set up/cooking: 1:00-3:30

Servers: 3:00-5:00

Cleaners: 4:45-6:00

The kitchen is quite small, so if you want to help, please contact the coordinator so we don't end up with too many cooks in the kitchen!

You can also help by donating food or money for food. Or if you'd like to bake cookies, cupcakes, or other desserts ahead of time (note: we cook for 150, so if it's too much, you could always split this with another baker)

Safety Team Update

The safety of the congregants and the functionality of our facilities are a serious concern to all of us. A Safety Team formed by the Board of Directors and chaired by Greg Kramer, has been looking at ways to provide a proper level of safety recommended for churches. The Team has accessed local church groups, police and fire departments, our insurance carrier (Church Mutual), FBI, and Homeland Security educational sources. The educational materials are abundant and provides suggestions for large to small churches in rural as well as urban communities---churches with meager to large budgets and with above and below average volunteer and staff capabilities.

As with all the church's endeavors, developing a safety plan to include protective strategies to deal with fires, shooters, bomb threats or other risks is an important mission. Without question, this mission warrants the time, caution, energy and commitment for the Board of Directors, the Safety Team and indeed the entire congregation. All our research to date reinforces our beliefs that careful planning and preparation could undoubtedly make this church safer and give each of us a greater sense of control over unpredictable crises.

Preparing a comprehensive proposal for the Board of Directors to review, is our next step. We are identifying safety concerns and potential solutions and the next part of our assessment will solicit ideas from the congregation. Thus, this announcement is a progress report to the larger congregation as well as an invitation to let us know your relevant thoughts and suggestions.
