Kitchen of Hope Monday, July 5

No volunteers are needed for Kitchen of Hope this month, but we are still serving meals.

The Kitchen of Hope is still serving meals to folks in need. In fact, the numbers have risen to 200+ a day. In an effort to keep volunteers and guests as safe as possible, the logistics have changed. Instead of a sit-down community meal, we now must serve to-go meals only, at the door, one at a time. We have adapted to this situation. And we, too, want to limit potential exposure for you.

Until things get back to normal, if you would like to help, please consider donating either money or food items that can go in a lunch bag. We serve once a month, but the Kitchen of Hope serves 6 nights a week.

Annual Report of Endowment Fund

HVUUC Board of Trustees

The HVUUC Endowment Fund has now been in existence for 12 full calendar years. As of December 31, 2020 the Endowment Fund had a balance of \$158,932.86. This represents an increase of \$24,940 from the previous year. The increase is due to a gift from Raj and Sharmi Mehta, former members of HVUUC, (\$10,000), a bequest from Michael Jones (\$5,000), memorial gifts totaling \$480, and investment income of \$10,221 less the amount distributed to the church operating budget. With the exception of a small amount of cash held in the Church's checking account, the funds are invested in the Vanguard Wellesley Income Fund. Over the life of the fund total investment returns have amounted to \$37,081. Currently the Wellesley Income Fund has a 1-year return of 14% and a 10-year return of 7.6%. These returns are in keeping with our Endowment Fund policy of protecting the portfolio from high volatility while providing a reasonable rate of return.

As you know, the Endowment Fund makes an annual distribution to the Church equal to four percent (4%) of the average balance for the previous three calendar years. Consequently, during the first month of the Church's fiscal year (June, 2021) the Endowment Fund will transfer to the Church's checking account \$4,428. This is \$1,633 more than the amount transferred in 2020.

According to the Endowment Bylaws approved by the congregation, determination of how the distributions from the Endowment Fund should be used is as follows.

"The use to be made of distributions from the Fund is determined by the congregation as part of its customary budgeting process. Generally, use of monies from the Fund shall be used as "seed money" to fund items such as, but not limited to: enhancing the ministry of the Church, subsidizing new initiatives and capital and major repairs. Distributions from the Fund may continue for these enhancements for reasonable start-up periods until the funding mechanisms are developed."

Treasurer's Corner

Fiscal Summary 2020/2021

The financial summary for the fiscal year 2020/2021 is shown below. Despite the challenges, we actually exceeded our anticipated income from pledges for the year! As expected, our auction income was low and our plate income was zero. Our resulting total income was \$12,612 below budgeted. Because expenses were only 92% of the budgeted amount, we still had a surplus for the year of \$2,070. This surplus allowed us to pay our full requested amount to the UUA annual fund, begin a designated fund for future employee health insurance with \$500, and bolster the capital repairs fund by \$1570. Even with the difficulties from the pandemic, we have accomplished many things this year, which says much about the strength of this congregation.

Gathering Guidelines

The Board of Trustees (BoT) voted at the May 19, 2021 meeting to **make changes to the facilities usage guidelines** and to **continue to hold virtual services**. These new guidelines will be through August 31, 2021 **Or** when the new Reopening Task Force has provided recommendations to the BoT.

A Reopening Task Force has been formed to research and provide recommendations to the BoT. There will be more communication about this task force's charge, membership, and progress in the coming weeks and months.

The following **NEW Gathering Guidelines** for small groups at our facilities (inside and outside of buildings) are now in place.

We strongly recommend continuing to use online forums for small group/committee/team meetings. However, the HVUUC Board has voted to allow people on site for activities as needed.

• Only 1 group may meet at a time inside the church building or on the deck. To schedule a room or the deck for your meeting or workgroup and to make sure other groups are not already scheduled, please contact Karyn at office@hvuuc.org to reserve your group on the church calendar. You can check the calendar to make sure there are no conflicts at: https://localendar.com/public/hvuuchurch

To locate the church calendar from the church website (hvuuc.org), go to the "News & Events" menu and select the 3rd item, "Church Calendar" from the drop-down menu.

Gathering Guidelines for **Inside** Church Facilities:

- No children's activities allowed at this time.
- Groups of 10 people and less
- Social Distancing of 6 feet should still be maintained between people of different households/pods.
- Guidance on face masks in small groups (please bring your own):
- ⇒ If the group is a **mix of unvaccinated and vaccinated** people **OR** if **vaccination status** of all attendees is **unknown**: **All attendees should wear a mask.**
- ⇒ If it is known that all attendees are fully vaccinated AND all agree: Attendees can choose to not wear a mask.
- ⇒ The Fred Ball room (fellowship hall), sanctuary, and deck are the best meeting areas. The REZ is available if all of the above guidelines can be followed.

Must **wash hands** with soap and water for 20 seconds upon entering buildings, or use hand sanitizer and let air dry. Hand sanitizer is in several locations (foyer, kitchen, REZ), to be used as needed.

Gathering Guidelines for **Outside** Church Facilities:

- No children's activities allowed at this time.
- Guidance on social distancing of 6 feet between people of different households/pods.
- ⇒ If the group is a mix of unvaccinated and vaccinated people OR if vaccination status of all attendees is unknown: All attendees should social distance.
- ⇒ If it is known that all attendees are fully vaccinated AND all agree: Attendees can choose to not social distance.
- Groups of 20 people and less are allowed if social distancing can be maintained in the location.
- Masks are not required for groups meeting outside.

Online Sunday services (on YouTube) will continue during this time. Virtual Religious Education (RE) activities for preschool through 12th grade will continue. Please register your children at RE Reg form

Gathering Guidelines for **Outside** Church Facilities:

- No children's activities allowed at this time.
- Guidance on social distancing of 6 feet between people of different households/pods.
- ⇒ If the group is a mix of unvaccinated and vaccinated people OR if vaccination status of all attendees is unknown: All attendees should social distance.
- ⇒ If it is known that all attendees are fully vaccinated AND all agree: Attendees can choose to not social distance.
- ⇒ Groups of **20 people and less** are allowed if social distancing can be maintained in the location.
- ⇒ Masks are not required for groups meeting outside.

Guidelines common for Inside and Outside:

- **Meals** should be **sack or box lunches**, no family style meals, ie pizza. No water coolers or other communal drinking, ie punch. Maintain 6 feet of distance during meals.
- If you are ill, have a fever/cough, are someone who is at increased risk, or traveled to endemic areas infected with COVID-19, please stay home and enjoy online content and fellowship.
- **Must clean** commonly touched hard surfaces like door handles, light switches, tables, counter tops, metal surfaces (chair backs), etc., **when finished.**
- Please use the cleaning wipes and/or bleach solution and paper towels in the foyer, kitchen, and REZ for cleaning/disinfecting after each visit.

Whenever possible **do not share work tools**. If sharing occurs, wipe down handles with disinfecting wipes before returning the tool.
