The 2019 TriPride Parade and Festival will be held in downtown Kingsport on September 7. This will be the first city-wide public Pride Parade in Kingsport!

The parade starts at 11AM and will go down E. Main to Clay St. The festival begins after the parade ends until 6:30PM. It will showcase vendor booths, music stages, arts and crafts, children's activities, food, and a [sidewalk chalk art competition](#) between Clinchfield St and W Market St. Please come out and support our LGBTQ community and show your support for Pride!



You can participate by:

- **Walking in the parade!** The Parade starts at 11:00AM. Walking units must report in by 10:30AM. Please dress up! If you have a church t-shirt wear that, otherwise something with rainbows, tie dye, or just something fun and colorful! Make up, beads, supportive signs, you get the idea! The parade begins at the intersection of East Main Street and Island Street, in front of Kingsport Cycles. It will go down East Main Street and end at Clay Street. This is only 5 blocks, about 1/4 mile.
- **Bake cupcakes!** Last year we had cupcakes at our booth in rainbow colors and they were very popular! We'd like to do that again and have even more to hand out.
- **Volunteer at our booth** to answer questions, hand out cupcakes, and tell festival goers about our church!

### Kingsport Kitchen of Hope September 2

In the basement of the Full Gospel Mission on Sevier St in Kingsport, is a tiny kitchen staffed entirely by volunteers that feeds dinner 6 days a week to 100-130 people. Diners have ranged from infant to 88. For many of them, it's their only meal of the day. The church serves dinner at the Kitchen of Hope the first Monday of each month. How can you help? Glad you asked.

The menu changes monthly. Volunteers are needed to help cook, serve and clean up.

**Set up/cooking: 1:00-3:30**

**Servers: 3:00-5:00**

**Cleaners: 4:45-6:00**

***The kitchen is quite small, so if you want to help, please contact the coordinator so we don't end up with too many cooks in the kitchen!***

You can also help by donating food or money for food. Or if you'd like to bake cookies, cupcakes, or other desserts ahead of time (note: we cook for 150, so if it's too much, you could always split this with another baker)

Like to plan ahead? We do this the first Monday of every month, so pencil us in with a big red pen!

### Family Promise Coordinator Needed

A new coordinator is needed for our church's quarterly volunteer involvement with Family Promise (formerly known as Interfaith Hospitality Network) at the Hopwood Church on the Milligan Highway. Family Promise helps families get back on their feet by providing shelter, food, and transportation. We help out overnight 4 times a year. Our next turn is Labor Day, and this one is covered, but it would be a good opportunity to get a feel for what is involved.

The coordinator is responsible for getting a volunteer for grocery shopping (we always make tacos and the shopping list is already written), two-three volunteers to cook the tacos, and two volunteers to stay overnight for each of our quarterly commitments. The first time the new coordinator would need to secure these volunteers is in early December.

### Get Your Grocery Store Shopping Cards!

The church sells prepaid shopping cards, in various denominations, in the Fellowship Hall after the service.

When you buy a card for \$100 from Food City or Ingles, this buys you \$100 worth of goods at that store, and the church makes 7%, which last year was about \$6000.

Register your Kroger customer card online, having our church as benefactor and we make about 5% every time you shop.

Just think of the results; if you just started to buy cards and you bought \$100 today, and then bought this amount every week for a year you would provide \$336 each year for the budget. We can all make a big difference if we unite behind this small effort!
